### Competitive Grant Eligibility

501(c)3 or equivalent or find a sponsor

> Majority of services in our 20-town region

Limited capital project funding available

Nondiscriminatory practices

**Grant reports** must be up-todate

> Certain projects less likely to be funded



#### **Guiding Principles for Nonprofits**

It is the belief of The Community Foundations that the best use of the community's endowment is to invest in nonprofits that display the following:

- Vision for the Community: clear goals and objectives for community impact informed by a planning process that includes input by stakeholders with lived experience
- Social & Structural Determinants of Equity: how your mission and your work contribute to improving the social and structural determinants of equity.
- Accountability: ongoing evaluation of impact
- Vision for the Organization: clear goals and objectives for how it maintain or improve its governance, management, operations and programs
- Culture of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion: policies and procedures that respect and advance diversity, equity and inclusion; members of the Board and staff reflect the community served.
- Vitality: sound practices for financial management, with a lens for sustainability

Responsive Grants - Statewide or Multi-Region Program support for GNH area programming (>50% of population served living outside 20-town region)	Flexible funding; up to \$50,000	March 2, 2023, 5 p.m.
Responsive Grants – Capital (>50% of population served living inside 20-town region)	Capital expenditures; up to \$60,000	Letter of intent by August 1, 2023
Nonprofit Animal Shelter Grants	Flexible funding; up to \$7,500	Ongoing
Nonprofit Management Program for Emerging Leaders of Color	Leadership development; flexible funding; \$10,000/yr; 2-year grants	June 5, 2023, 5 p.m.
Consultant Support Program	Short-term project for building capacity; one time per year.	Ongoing

## NONPROFIT ANIMAL SHELTER GRANTS

Any nonprofit animal shelter serving the Greater New Haven area is eligible to apply for up to \$7,500 in funding through The Community Foundation for Greater New Haven's Lillian and Henry A. Konopacke Fund. Average grant, \$3000-\$5,000. New or existing program; organizational capacity building or capital





## THE QUINNIPIAC RIVER FUND GRANTS

The mission of the Quinnipiac River Fund is to improve the environmental quality of the Quinnipiac River and New Haven Harbor and their watersheds. Applications closed January 20, 2023

## Nonprofit Management Cohort for Emerging Leaders of Color



- Leadership development for emerging leaders of color.
- Flexible funding \$10,000 per year/two years.
- Applications opening April 2, 2023; Deadline to apply June 5, 2023.
- Applicant is program participant, NOT organization.
- Application will be available on www.cfgnh.org and www.valleyfoundation.org

#### Greater New Haven Small Grants

- Available to organizations with annual operating budgets less than \$2M
- Three types of applications: GOS, Project and Capacity Building
- Up to \$15K; one year only; rolling applications
- Can apply every other year
- 8-10 week turnaround

# Small Grant Types General Operating Support



- Flexible funding
- Further the general mission and work of an organization
- Can be used for operations, program and capital (but not all capital)
- 8-10 week turnaround

# Small Grant Types Program Support



- For a specific new or existing program
- One or two linked programs that can be budgeted independently
- If ongoing program, past outcomes will be compelling for future funding
- If new program, community input and strong evaluation will be compelling

# Small Grant Types Capacity Building Support

- For short-term financial assistance to build the infrastructure of an organization for long term success
- Includes small capital requests
- Projects like board development, strategic planning, evaluation
- Capital purchases like equipment, computers, building renovations, furniture

### **Consultant Support Program**

- Short-term project for building capacity or Board/staff work on diversity, equity, inclusion & belonging.
- Consultant Support Program


