

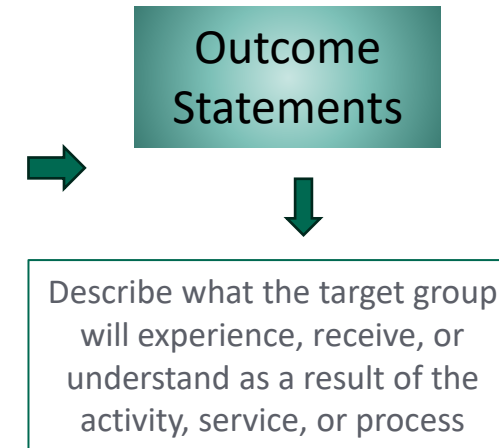

Defining Outcomes & Outcome Measures

	OUTCOMES	OUTCOME MEASURES
Definition	Specific changes in those you serve or the conditions in your environment as a result of program activities or specified action	Data you will collect and analyze to indicate achievement toward the stated outcomes – often expressed in percentages or #'s
Examples	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Students' improved math scores ○ Increased household income for low-income families ○ Reduced evictions for veterans ○ Increased organizational effectiveness 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ % of students with improved math scores ○ % of families that increase household income by 10% ○ % reduction in the number of veterans experiencing evictions ○ # of organizational credentials received in 2025

Who/What (the target subject)	Describe the Change (action word)	Degree of Change (optional)	Activities or Intervention (what will be completed)
Teenage youth	improve leadership skills		summer camp participation
Low-income families	increase their use of support services	by 25%	referrals to local organizations
Community Management Team	reduce sewer contamination		implementation of a waste management plan

- Teenage youth will improve their leadership skills through summer camp participation
- Low-income families will increase their use of supportive services by 25% through referrals to local organizations
- The Community Management Team will reduce sewer contamination through the implementation of a waste management plan
