Guiding Principles for Nonprofits

It is the belief of The Community Foundations that the best use of the community's endowment is to invest in nonprofits that display the following:

- Vision for the Community: clear goals and objectives for community impact informed by a planning process that includes input by stakeholders with lived experience
- Social & Structural Determinants of Equity: how your mission and your work contribute to improving the social and structural determinants of equity.
- Accountability: ongoing evaluation of impact
- Vision for the Organization: clear goals and objectives for how it maintain or improve its governance, management, operations and programs
- Culture of Diversity, Equity and Inclusion: policies and procedures that respect and advance diversity, equity and inclusion; members of the Board and staff reflect the community served.
- Vitality: sound practices for financial management, with a lens for sustainability

Competitive Grant Eligibility

 501(c)3 or equivalent or find a sponsor

Majority of services in our 20-town region

Limited capital project funding available

Nondiscriminatory practices Grant reports must be up-todate

Certain projects less likely to be funded

Responsive Grants General Operating Support (GOS)



To further the general mission and work of an organization, rather than for a specific purpose or project

- Applicants must have a published giveGreater.org® profile
- An organization cannot apply if it has a current GOS grant that extends beyond 2022
- Average grant size is between \$20K-\$35K per year
- Application link on websites
- 1, 2 and 3 year grants awarded
- Awards made in July

Grants for Racial Equity + Creative Healing Through the Arts

- Support Creative and Equitable Recovery in our region
- Available to arts organizations and organizations with a history of arts programming
- Projects that break down racism, support learning for youth and provide opportunities for collective mourning, comfort and healing
- Applications open February 1; deadline to apply May 2, 2022
- Panel of artists to review; decisions by June/July

BIPOC-led Cohort for Nonprofit Leadership

 Two year program in leadership development for emerging leaders who are people of color

Application focused on BIPOC leader, not organization

Flexible funding up to \$15,000 per year/two years

Consultant Support Program

- Short-term project for building capacity including work in diversity, equity, inclusion and belonging
- Can cover consultant's time and some other expenses
- One time in 2022

Greater New Haven Small Grants



- For a specific new or existing program
- Three types of applications: GOS, Project and Capacity Building
- Up to \$15K; one year only; rolling applications
- 6-8 week turnaround
- Contact <u>dcanning@cfgnh.org</u> for application



Sponsorships



Greater New Haven-based organizations

- One-day virtual or in-person fundraising events, festivals or fairs (not for conferences or multi-day programs)
- Neighborhood events
- Up to \$2,500; rolling applications
- 4 week turnaround
- Applications available on <u>www.cfgnh.org</u>

Community Grants Valley-based organizations

FOUNDATION

- For civic engagement
- Available to organizations that are based in the Valley towns of Ansonia, Derby, Oxford, Seymour and Shelton, or whose majority of services are performed in these towns.



- Available to organizations with two or fewer full-time equivalent staff members
- Organizations do not have to be 501(c)3 or equivalent
- Up to \$2,500; deadline to apply: March 4, 2022
- Applications available on <u>www.valleyfoundation.org</u>

Needs and Opportunities Grants

Valley-based organizations

- For innovative and ongoing programs and emergency needs
- Available to organizations that are based in the Valley towns of Ansonia, Derby, Oxford, Seymour and Shelton, or whose majority of services are performed in these towns





- Organizations must be a 501(c)3 or equivalent, or must find a fiscal sponsor
- Up to \$10,000; rolling applications
- Applications available on <u>www.valleyfoundation.org</u>

Sponsorships Valley-based organizations



- One-day events
- Available to organizations based in the Valley towns of Ansonia, Derby, Oxford, Seymour and Shelton, or whose majority of services are performed in these towns


