A first-generation college student, Katherine decided that working in elementary education was the right career for her after shadowing teachers through a weekly program called, "Educators Rising." Observing the classroom and interacting with the young students confirmed what she always knew about herself — she loves spending time with children. She has been a babysitter for many years, ever since her first job watching the daughter of her mother's friend.
