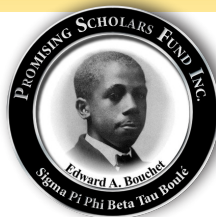

The Fund provides financial assistance to academically talented African-American graduates of Connecticut high schools pursuing undergraduate degrees. Beta Tau Boule's Edward A. Bouchet Awards are named for an African-American New Haven native and academic pioneer who earned a PhD in Physics from Yale in 1876 when less than 5 percent of all Americans graduated from high school. Edward Alexander Bouchet



Edward A. Bouchet (1852-1918) was born, raised, and educated in New Haven, CT. He graduated from Hopkins School and Yale College, prior to earning his PhD in physics in 1876. When he defended his doctoral dissertation on

geometrical optics, he became the first African American to earn a doctorate from any American university and only the sixth person in the Western Hemisphere to earn a doctorate in physics. As an undergraduate he was awarded highest honors (Valedictorian) and was one of the first African-Americans inducted into the Phi Beta Kappa Society, the nation's oldest and most prestigious academic honor society.



Sigma Pi Phi Fraternity was founded on May 15, 1904 in Philadelphia, PA. Its founders, led by Dr. Henry M. Minton, established a fellowship of men united by academic and professional achievement, commitment to our community, and congeniality. Now, with thousands of members internationally, we have men representing nearly every academic discipline and profession including; attorneys, artists, business executives, clergymen, entrepreneurs, government officials, philanthropist, physicians and surgeons amongst our ranks. Across our diverse vocations we have forged bonds that yield enduring fellowship. Originally, founded to provide a social outlet for educated black men, the fraternity today has a broader agenda. We endeavor to model leadership and civic responsibility while mentoring young men to advance our community towards equality with both respect and devotion to democratic traditions.
