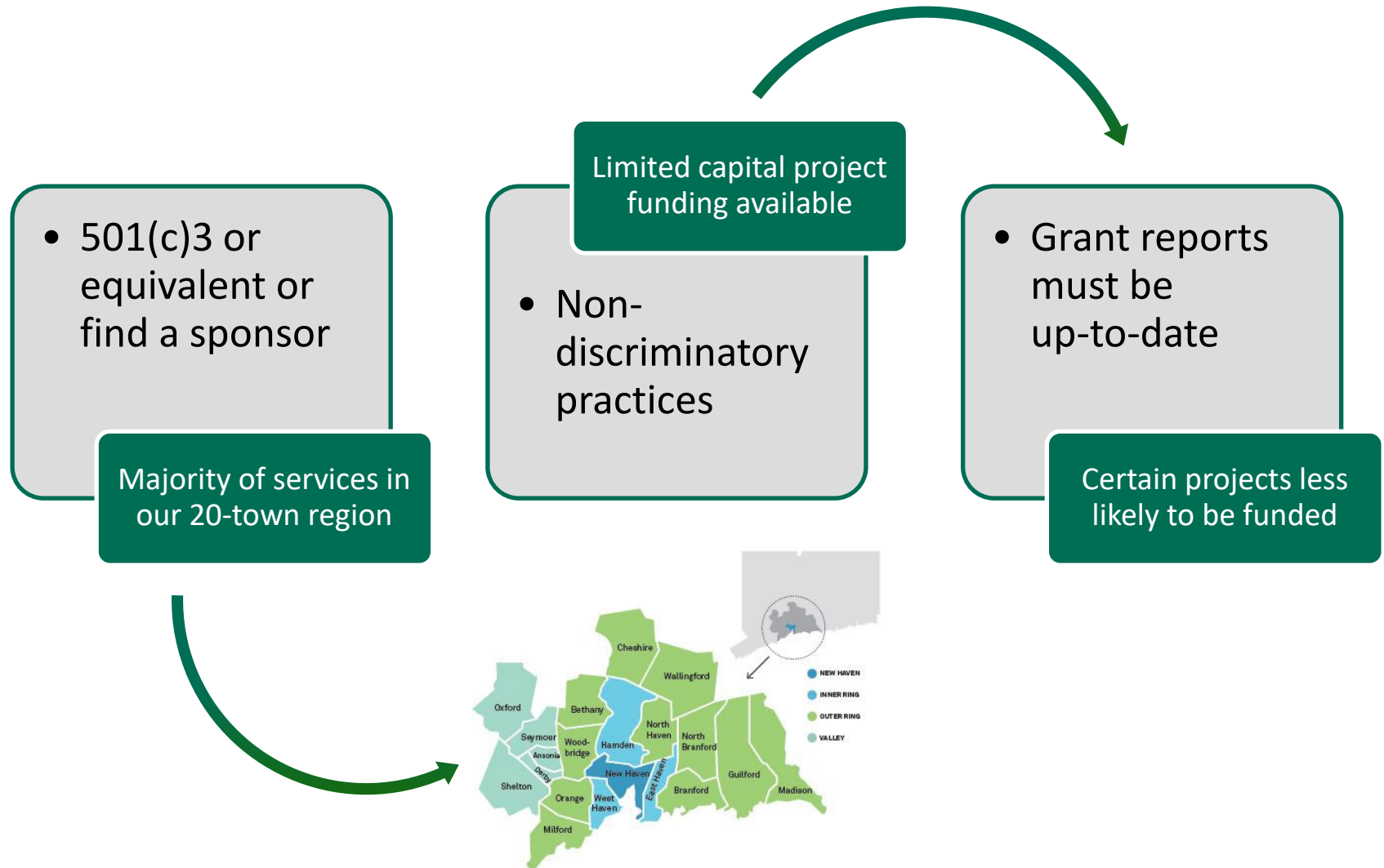

Competitive Grant Eligibility



Grantmaking in 2023



- ✓ 2023 is a year of transition for The Community Foundations.
- ✓ Responsive Grants are for one year.
- ✓ Nonprofits in the TCF service area are eligible to apply for general operating support grants.
- ✓ Statewide and multi-region nonprofits are eligible to apply for program support grants.
- ✓ Capital Project Support will be a separate process.

Responsive Grants – Capital (>50% of population served living inside 20-town region)	Capital expenditures; up to \$60,000	Letter of intent by August 1, 2023
Nonprofit Animal Shelter Grants	Flexible funding; up to \$7,500	Ongoing

Responsive Grant Type

General Operating Support (GOS)



Flexible funding that a nonprofit organization can use to further its mission rather than for a specific purpose or project.

- More than 50% of the population served by the organization must live in Greater New Haven and/or the Valley.
- The Applicant must have an up-to-date, published giveGreater.org[®] profile.
- The Applicant must have had active programming for at least two years.
- An organization cannot apply if it has a current GOS grant that extends beyond 2023.
- Grants up to \$50,000; only one-year grants to be awarded.
- Application available on www.cfgnh.org and www.valleyfoundation.org

Responsive Grant Type

Program Support for Statewide and Multi-Region Organizations

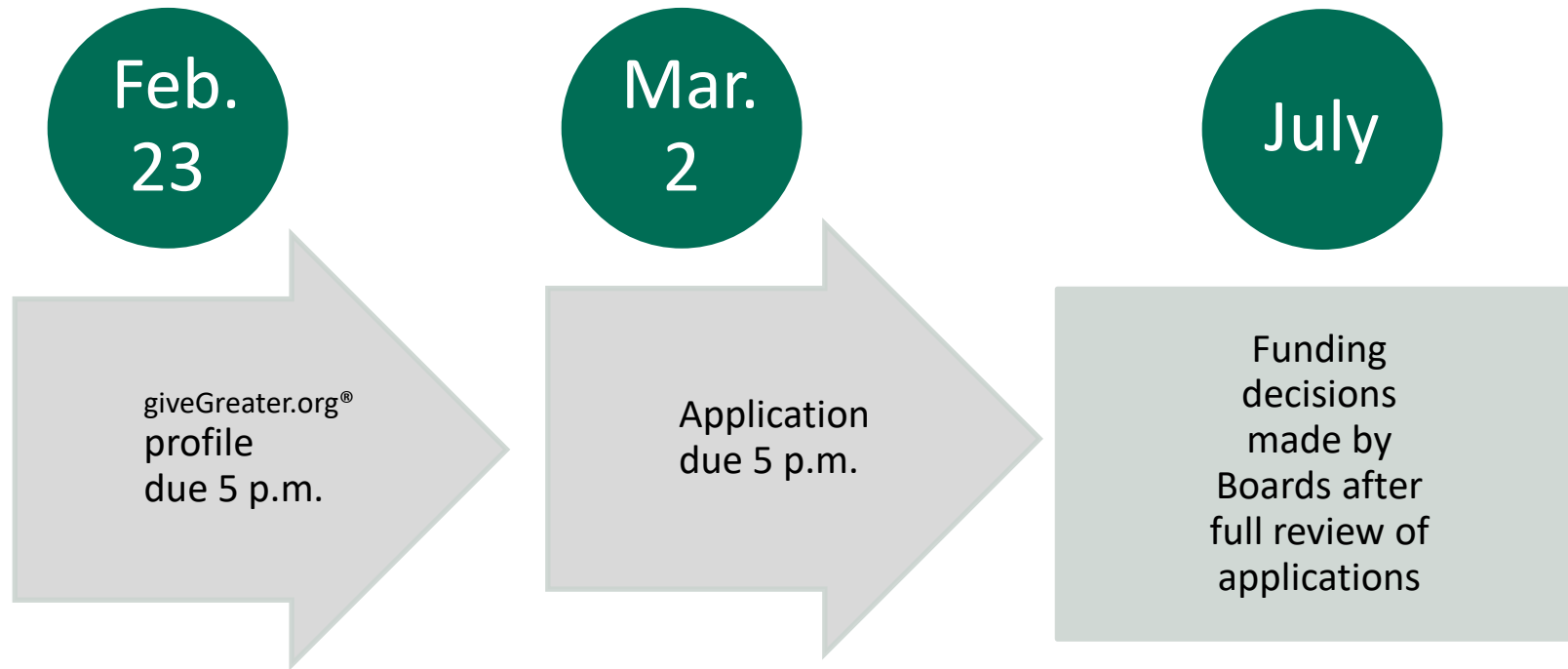


For a new or existing specific segment of an organization's work that services one or more towns in The Community Foundations' region.

- More than 50% of the population served by the organization must live outside Greater New Haven and/or the Valley.
- Applicants must have an up-to-date, published giveGreater.org® profile.
- The Applicant must have had active programming for at least two years.
- An organization cannot apply if it has a current GOS grant that extends beyond 2023.
- Grants up to \$50,000; one-year grants to be awarded.
- Application available on www.cfgnh.org and www.valleyfoundation.org

2023 Review Process and Timeline

Responsive General Operating Support



Responsive Grant Type

Capital



For capital projects like land/building acquisition, construction, renovation, physical plant improvements, equipment purchases.

- Applicants must have a published giveGreater.org® profile.
- An organization cannot apply if it has a current GOS grant that extends beyond 2023.
- The Applicant must have had active programming for at least two years.
- Grants up to \$60,000; one- or two-year grants to be awarded.
- Details on application process will follow; letter of intent will be due August 1, 2023.
- If invited to apply, grants will be considered in December.

Animal Shelter Grants



- Funding for any nonprofit animal shelter serving Greater New Haven.
- Up to \$7,500 per year; rolling applications.
- 8-week turnaround.
- Application will be available on www.cfgnh.org and www.valleyfoundation.org

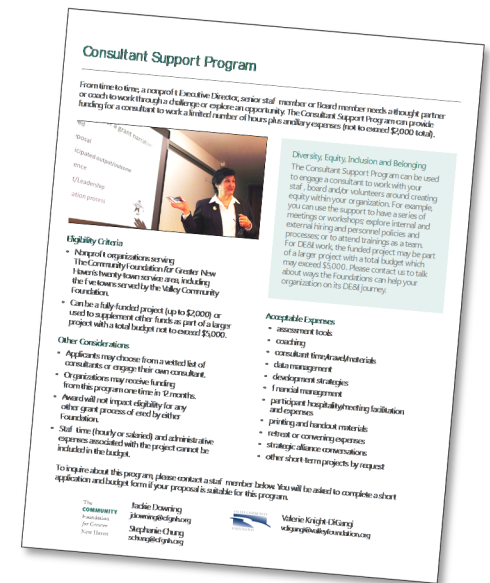
Nonprofit Management Cohort for Emerging Leaders of Color



- Leadership development for emerging leaders of color.
- Flexible funding \$10,000 per year/two years.
- Applications opening April 2, 2023; Deadline to apply June 5, 2023.
- Applicant is program participant, NOT organization.
- Application will be available on www.cfgnh.org and www.valleyfoundation.org

Consultant Support Program

- Short-term project for building capacity or Board/staff work on diversity, equity, inclusion & belonging.
- Can cover consultant's time and some other expenses.
- One time in 2023.

- For a specific new or existing program.
- Available to organizations with annual operating budgets less than \$2M.
- Up to \$15K per year; rolling applications.
- 8-10 week turnaround.

Small Grant Types

Capacity Building Support

- For short-term financial assistance to build the infrastructure of an organization for long term success.
- Includes small capital requests.
- Available to organizations with annual operating budgets less than \$2M.
- Up to \$15K per year; rolling applications.
- 8-10 week turnaround.

- Available to organizations with annual operating budgets less than \$2M.

- One-day fundraising events; virtual or in-person.
- Neighborhood events.
- Up to \$2,500; rolling applications.
- 4-week turnaround.

Community Grants

Valley-based organizations



- For civic engagement.
- Available to organizations that are based in the Valley towns of Ansonia, Derby, Oxford, Seymour and Shelton, or whose majority of services are performed in these towns.
- Available to organizations with two or fewer full-time equivalent staff members.
- Organizations do not have to be 501(c)3 or equivalent.
- Up to \$2,500; deadline to apply: March 3, 2023; awards in May.
- Applications available on www.valleyfoundation.org



Sponsorships

Valley-based organizations



- One-day events.
- Available to organizations based in the Valley towns of Ansonia, Derby, Oxford, Seymour and/or Shelton, or whose majority of services are performed in these towns.
- Organizations must be a 501(c)3 or equivalent, or must have a fiscal sponsor.
- Up to \$2,500; rolling applications.
- Applications available on www.valleyfoundation.org



Needs and Opportunities Grants

Valley-based organizations



- For innovative and ongoing programs and emergency needs.
- Available to organizations that are based in the Valley towns of Ansonia, Derby, Oxford, Seymour and/or Shelton, or whose majority of services are performed in these towns.
- Organizations must be a 501(c)3 or equivalent, or must have a fiscal sponsor.
- Up to \$10,000; rolling applications.
- Applications available on www.valleyfoundation.org

- Applicants requesting a Responsive Grant must create or update a giveGreater.org® profile as part of the application.
- To complete a giveGreater.org® profile, contact Stephanie Chung at chung@cfgnh.org.
- A giveGreater.org® profile is different than a Great Give profile.
- If your organization has an active www.giveGreater.org® profile that is viewable to the public, the expiration date must be after February 23, 2023. If the date is before February 23, 2023, it must be updated.

Benefits of having a giveGreater.org® profile

No Cost

A giveGreater.org® profile is free. There is no cost to maintain a profile and no monthly fee for online giving access.

New Donors

Nonprofits report receiving gifts from new donors.

Access to Special Trainings

Nonprofits with a published profile can participate in special workshops, such as those created to help engage donors, strengthen marketing and social media outreach and properly account for gifts received during The Great Give®.

Multiple Uses

giveGreater.org® nonprofit organizations report using their profiles to apply for grant funding; others use it as an outreach tool or for Board/staff orientation.
