


#### Within the region, only New Haven and Orange saw measurable population growth



Source: 2010 and 2020 Censuses


## Greater New Haven's housing stock grew by 5,191 units, half in New Haven alone; East Haven lost many units

Change in total housing units, 2010-2020, for 13 Greater New Haven area towns




#### New Haven remains the most racially and ethnically diverse city in the region...

Population under age 18, by race, 2020




#### **Neighborhood Population Change**

### **Methods: Key Points**

- Fifth wave of DataHaven survey (2021) designed with input from 300
   Advisory Council members and 80 public/private funders adding new questions on demographics, food access, COVID, incarceration, and other topics
- through August; interviews are continuing throughout 2021

  For the initial data release, live interviewers completed 5 1/15 interviews in

Initial data release in October 2021 is based on data collected from June

- For the initial data release, live interviewers completed 5,145 interviews in English and Spanish by calling randomly-selected landline/cell phones
- Interviews are weighted to create reliable estimates that are representative of populations in each area



#### Black, Latino, and Low-Income Adults Face More Hurdles To Meet Basic Needs


Share of Connecticut adults, Aug. 2021

Underemployment rate among Connecticut adults, 2015–2021





Health and Wellbeing

#### Survey illustrates impacts of the pandemic on wellbeing 17% of adults (480,000 adults) had close friends or family die due to COVID 24% say they had COVID themselves, 3% (94,000) had severe symptoms 24% lost a job or were laid off, including 37% of Latino adults Adults with employment insecurity were more likely to report other concerns 12% received meals from a food pantry or soup kitchen 15% of adults living with children, 23% of adults in city centers Since 2015/2018, the perception that residents can obtain a good job has risen for all age groups, except for young adults; relatively higher anxiety among young adults **Better off financially About the same Worse off financially** Income financially <\$15K 16% 48% **35%** \$50K-\$75K **25**% **57**% 18% >\$200K 46% 47% **7**% **DataHaven**

### Throughout the State, Trust is High for Local Health Officials, Split for Police, and Low for Federal Government


Share of Connecticut adults reporting a great or fair amount of trust in various institutions by type of town, Aug. 2021



The Five Connecticuts is a system used to classify individual towns into one of five categories (Wealthy, Suburban, Rural, Urban Periphery, and Urban Core) based on the median household income, population density, and poverty rate of each town.


#### As Vaccination Rates Rise, Holdouts Remain

Share of adults who are vaccinated, and reported plans of unvaccinated Connecticut adults, Aug. 2021





Share of adults who are vaccinated, and reported plans of unvaccinated Connecticut adults, Aug. 2021




#### Masking Remains High Among Groups Overrepresented in Essential Jobs



Younger adults are less likely than older adults to own their homes across several race/ethnicity groups. However, in most towns, younger white adults own their homes at rates comparable to or higher than older Black and Latino adults.
